A highlight was the first Walk Against Elder Abuse in Launceston on International World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, 15 June. This is a universal day to promote respect and dignity for older people. The City of Launceston supported COTA Tasmania with organising the street march followed by speeches on the Town Hall steps then a morning tea in the Town Hall Reception Room. Over 50 people attended the inaugural Launceston street march which will continue to grow each year.

Civic Square came alive with the Launceston Night Market as the first event to activate the newly refurbished space on Saturday 14 July. The Market coincided with the final Hawthorn game in Launceston for the year and, offered patrons a food and wine experience with performances by local choirs and a community sing-a-long.

Major Projects Around the City


Brisbane Street Mall

The Brisbane Street Mall redevelopment works are well underway which are expected to be completed by the end of September. Crews have worked many nights to remove the old shelter, complete underground pipework and electrical works with the paving crews starting around 4.00am each day. Businesses are open as usual throughout the works.



Civic Square

The Civic Square is now open. Dotted throughout the Civic Square from Charles Street to St John Street are 40 paver inlays. These inlays are short stories on the history of Launceston.



Seaport Pedestrian Bridge

The new pedestrian and cycling bridge linking the Seaport to Riverbend Park is now open for public use. A local group, BridgePro Engineering was the main contractor, along with Haywards Steel who manufactured the bridge. It's a great walk with a dedicated pedestrian link all the way from Cataract Gorge, through Kings Park and Royal Park, to the Seaport and across the bridge to Riverbend Park.

Macquarie House

The four-level sandstone brick building will be restored and refurbished, taking it back to its original open floor configuration.

Originally built in 1829-30, Macquarie House will be transformed into an innovation, entrepreneurship and technology hub.

The construction of a new extension at the rear of the building will allow the installation of amenities, service ducts, a stairway and lift access.



Cataract Gorge playspace

Works have begun to upgrade the playspace at the Cataract Gorge's First Basin.

The proposed upgrade will see the existing play area directly in front of the cafe and public amenities transformed into a vibrant new nature-based play zone featuring disabled access, a children's amphitheatre, a water play zone, native plantings, boulders, tree trunks, a sand pit, an accessible swing set, a tunnel slide, a giant mouse-wheel treadmill and an extended forecourt outside the amenities building.

Importantly, the new play area will be built to the same level as the existing public amenities, meaning access to the site will be easier for parents, grandparents and people with disabilities.
