Enterprise Growth - Business Connect

Providing opportunities for small business to establish themselves, network, grow and flourish by collaborating with local business service providers.

Informative workshops with approximately 150 participants, delivered throughout the Northern Suburbs, including:

Celebration of Community Events

The focus on strategic collaborations, including the co-design and planning with community to support cultural, heritage and significant place-based events.

Celebrating community assets, pride of place and wellbeing with approximately 550 people in attendance. Events included:

Celebration of Community Strengths - Healthy & **Connected Communities**

This six-week program provided training to 16 residents of the Northern Suburbs to plan community projects. Participants learned how to secure funding, develop and deliver projects, evaluate outcomes, and share their stories. The program nurtured sustainable community-led projects, using a strengths-based, capacity-building framework to equip communities with the skills to develop their own local health and wellbeing initiatives

Liveability - Digital Inclusion Wi-Fi Project

Since the inception of My Place My Future, the Wi-Fi project outlines an approach to continuous digital inclusion and improvement to the liveability of the Northern Suburbs. Those without internet at home are able to access free Wi-Fi in seven locations in the Northern Suburbs, enabling access for employment opportunities, downloading information, paying bills and connecting with people.

Access - The Food and Resilience Movement (FaRM) Project

The City of Launceston is a significant financial and strategic partner of the FaRM Project, led by the Northern Suburbs Community Centre. The FaRM project was successful in obtaining a \$500,000 grant from the Tasmanian Community Fund which will be funded over a 5-year period. This project addresses wellbeing, social inclusion, food security and the development of a social enterprise in the Northern Suburbs.

Celebrating Community Events

Co-design, plan and collaborate with community to support cultural, heritage and significant place-based community events.

Celebrating Community Strengths

Foster and support the establishment of place-based community-led action groups in the Northern Suburbs.

Councillor/Community Engagement

Opportunity to host the City of Launceston Council Workshop meeting, together with a community lunch in the Northern Suburbs in 2023.

Rocherlea Access Project

Improving accessibility at The Shed, Rocherlea with carpark and driveway works to be completed by December 2023.

Digital Inclusion

Tasmania is most the digitally disadvantaged state in Australia, for the sixth year in a row (Australian Digital Inclusion Index 2023). Advocate for more sustainable solutions for digital inclusion in Tasmania.

Food Security

The Community Development Officer - Northern Suburbs will continue to support the FaRM project which addresses wellbeing, social inclusion, food security and the development of a social enterprise in the Northern Suburbs.
