The City of Launceston has had another busy few months with many developments and initiatives happening throughout the city. We celebrated the 2018 Seniors Week in October with two free events, Speed Chats and Morning Tea at Lilydale District School and the Seniors Morning Tea and Information Session in Civic Square, with each event being a huge success.

For Tasmanian football fans, there is plenty to look forward to following the 2019 AFL fixture release. The season will kick off with a blockbuster pre-season clash on Sunday 9 March and a Sunday afternoon match on 28 April, both between Hawthorn and Carton at UTAS Stadium. We also offer a waste collection service for people with disabilities or injuries.

The project is part of the City of Launceston's ABCDE (asset based community driven effort) Learning Site which Council has been delivering throughout Ravenswood in 2018. The sign idea came from Sharon Leonard, a long-time resident of the suburb and I commend Sharon for her incredible vision which has been warmly received by the community.




Launceston Suicide Prevention Trial

As a part of a national trial program the City of Launceston, with support from Primary Health Tasmania, is working with a range of community stakeholders to deliver activities aimed at reducing suicide and the impacts that suicide can have. The Black Dog Institute's LifeSpan suicide prevention framework is being used which combines nine strategies that have strong evidence for suicide prevention into one community-led approach.

Although thoughts of suicide may impact anyone, this trial will focus on men aged 40 to 64 years (who have the highest rate of suicide in Tasmania) as well as men and women over the age of 65, of which Tasmania has the highest proportion in the country. When it comes to suicide prevention, we all have a role to play to create an environment where we can reduce risk factors to suicide and promote the protective factors that make us more resilient. How prepared are you for a bushfire?

It's that time of the year again and it's really important to have a Bushfire Plan prepared and well understood by family and friends. The safest option should a bushfire be likely to threaten your property is to leave early and avoid danger. Leaving early is always your safest option.

When will you leave? What will prompt you to go? A fire danger rating of catastrophic or extreme? On these days leaving early is the safest option for you and your family. Days rated catastrophic or extreme are the worst conditions for bush or grass fires. Fires on these days are likely to be uncontrollable, very fast moving and unpredictable with aggressive flames extending high above buildings and tree tops. Plan to leave many hours before the fire reaches your property to avoid being caught in smoke, embers, the fire or on a congested road. Most people who die in bushfires are caught in the open, either in their car or on foot because they've left their property too late.

If you have animals and pets re-locate them early to a safe location with a friend or relative away from the fire area.
